DECLARATION OF EXISTING STATE OF EMERGENCY IN THE TOWN OF PENFIELD

A State of Emergency is hereby declared in the Town of Penfield, effective 5:00pm, September 10, 2017.


The State of Emergency has been declared due to rising water levels along Lake Ontario and Irondequoit Bay.

This situation threatens public safety and public health in the Town of Penfield.


The State of Emergency will remain in effect until for a period not to exceed 5 days or until rescinded by another executive order, whichever occurs first.

As Supervisor of the Town of Penfield, I, R. Anthony LaFountain, exercise the authority given me under Section 24 of the New York State Executive Law, to preserve the public safety and hereby render all required and available assistance vital to the security, well-being and health of the citizens of this Town.

I hereby direct all departments and agencies of the Town of Penfield to take whatever steps necessary to protect life and property, public infrastructure, and provide such emergency assistance deemed necessary.

STATE OF EMERGENCY

EMERGENCY ORDER # 20

As Supervisor of the Town of Penfield, I, R. Anthony LaFountain, exercising the authority given me under Section 24 of the New York State Executive Law, issue the following Executive Order:

This executive order hereby regulates the rate in which vessels navigating Irondequoit Bay can travel within the Town limits of the Town of Penfield.

Any vessel navigating Irondequoit Bay within 500 feet of the shoreline shall not exceed a speed limit of five (5) miles per hour.

Any person who knowingly disobeys this emergency order shall be in violation of Section 232-15B of the Penfield Town Code, and shall be punished pursuant to Section 232-41 of the Penfield Town Code.

This order shall be effective at 5:00pm, September 10, 2017 and remain in effect for a period not to exceed five days or until rescinded by the chief executive, whichever occurs first.
